
Rising Selectivity at California's Public Universities



Getting into the University of California

Students in six of nine UC campuses had average GPAs exceeding 4.0 in Fall 2014

Median SAT scores for admitted students to UCLA in Fall 2014 were less than 400 points from a perfect score



2016-17 campuses that have increased admissions standards for all freshman applicants

- CSU Long Beach
- CSU San Diego
- CSU San Jose
- CSU San Luis Obispo

The percentage of impacted majors systemwide is up 135% since 2004.

Due to reductions in state funding, 139,697 CSU eligible students were denied admission between 2009-2014



Roughly the equivalent of the current population of the city of Pasadena


Getting into the California State University

49th California's rank for four-year enrollment within the college-age population


45th California's rank in Bachelor's degree completion within the college-age population



Who's paying for college?

As state funding decreases, tuition increases at California's public universities

State funding for the UC and CSU is still lower than it was nine years ago
